# Spanish for Business Part 1

## Course learning outcomes

By the end of the course, successful students will be able to do the following:

1. **Explain** various **aspects of business** in detail.
2. **Explain** past successes and failures of **particular businesses**.
3. **Argue** (orally and in writing) in the **context of business**.
4. **Hypothesize** about the effects of **business decisions** and possible reactions to those effects.
5. **Work and communicate in groups** in order to accomplish **business-related tasks**.
6. **Write a coherent business letter**.
7. **Describe and explain** (orally and in writing) aspects of **culture** that are important for **doing business** in Spain and Latin America.



# Steps for integrated activities

1. **Prepare** for the activity through reception and discussion of texts related to the content being studied.
2. **Process** another text related to the content being studied that exemplifies the language function being developed.
3. **Notice** examples of the language function, pointed out in the text by the instructor.
4. **Review** vocabulary and structures that support the function.
5. **Practice** using the function in the context of the content being studied.
6. **Apply** the function to a task involving the content.



# Sample Activity: “Expressing an argument regarding business structures”

- 1. Prepare:** Students read about and discuss business structures.
- 2. Process:** They read a case study related to this topic.
- 3. Notice:** They see a copy of the case study, with language for expressing arguments underlined.
- 4. Review:** They review language for expressing arguments
- 5. Practice:** They practice expressing arguments in a business context.
- 6. Apply:** Students select a solution and use the appropriate language to support it.
